Applicants for taught programmes should submit a brief 'statement of purpose', giving an account of their motivation for graduate study at Oxford. You may wish to consider a number of issues: what relevant academic, research or practical experience do you have? Why are you applying to this particular programme of study? What areas of study in the subject interest you? One page is usually sufficient, which should be submitted as a separate sheet enclosed with the application.

Applicants for research and 'research preparation' programmes (the D.Phil., M.Litt., M.Sc. by research, or M.St. in research methods, including the M.St. Legal Research) should outline their research plans. Up to two pages is normally sufficient (unless a department states otherwise below), which should be submitted as a separate document enclosed with the application.

The amount of detail required will vary between different subject areas, and applicants may wish to seek further advice from their department or faculty before writing their proposal (contact details are given in the prospectus and online). For example, applicants for research programmes in the humanities and social sciences will usually be expected to submit a comparatively well-developed proposal, giving an outline of how they intend to structure and undertake their research, and including, where possible, a preliminary title for the thesis. In other subjects applicants will simply need to describe the preparatory reading and coursework that has motivated their choice of subject area. Some departments have chosen to offer specific advice to their applicants, which is given below.

Biochemistry: Provide a brief indication of the area of your proposed research, from the list on our website. Please also give the names of supervisors, in order of preference, with whom you would like to work (for both please see http://www.bioch.ox.ac.uk/graduate/research_areas).
