The Fulbright Visiting Scholar Program brings scholars to the United States for up to one academic year of professional research with the goal of increasing mutual understanding between the people of the United States and the people of other countries. The Fulbright experience should be of value not only to the scholar, but also to the scholar's home university – its students and faculty – as well as to the host U.S. institution. Fulbright scholars serve as cultural ambassadors and should be prepared to speak about their country, culture, and research to academic and community groups.

- Doctoral degree
- English language proficiency

- Detailed statement of proposed activity for research and/or lecturing in the United States
- Detailed Curriculum Vitae (resume)
- Three (3) Letters of Reference
- Photocopy of Doctoral Degree
- Bibliography (research proposal) and/or Course Syllabi (lecture proposal)
- Letter of invitation from U.S. Institution (if available)
