What is an “Open Society?”

An Open Society is a society based on the recognition that nobody has a monopoly on the truth, that different people have different views and interests, and that there is a need for institutions to protect the rights of all people to allow them to live together in peace. The term “open society” was popularized by the philosopher Karl Popper in his 1945 book Open Society and Its Enemies. Broadly speaking, an open society is characterized by a reliance on the rule of law, the existence of a democratically elected government, a diverse and vigorous civil society, and a respect for minorities and minority opinions.

Program Description:

The Network Scholarship Programs department of the Open Society Institute is pleased to offer supplementary grants to students from select countries of Eastern and Central Europe, the former Soviet Union, and Mongolia. The purpose of the program is to enable qualified students to pursue full-time doctoral studies in the **Humanities and Social Sciences** at accredited universities in Asia, Australia, Europe, the Middle/Near East, and North America.

The GSGP will provide supplemental funding for one year of study. Recipients of GSGP grants will have the option to re-apply for an additional two awards after the first year of the original grant. Applicants seeking grant renewals must submit a new application for the year for which they are re-applying. The total number of years a recipient may hold a GSGP grant is three years. Grantees applying for their second or third awards will compete with the general pool of applicants each year. A second or third grant is therefore not guaranteed.

Only students who have been accepted into a full-time doctoral (Ph.D.) program at an accredited university are eligible to apply.

Grants are provided to help cover costs in **only one** of the following categories:

1. **Tuition and fees** – not to exceed 50% of tuition and fees per academic year;
2. **Living expenses** – students who have succeeded in funding their tuition, either through scholarships or tuition wavers, are eligible for housing and living funds;
3. **Other** – students who have secured all necessary funds but cannot afford additional expenses, such as travel to/from their host country, books, materials, health insurance, etc., are eligible for additional funds.

Grants will not be provided to cover expenses in *all three* categories. Only those students with confirmed financial support will receive supplementary grants.

Grants will be awarded on the basis of academic record, merit of the proposed study, applicant's long-term goals, and financial need.

For the academic year 2009-2010 grants will be awarded in amounts ranging from \$500 to \$6000

In no case may applicants request grant assistance for the support of:

1. *accompanying child/children or spouse;*
2. *federal and/or state taxes;*
3. *computer hardware, software or other computer-related equipment;*
4. *automobile-related expenses of any type.*

Eligibility Criteria:

Applicants must review the following information, comply with the guidelines and complete the attached application form to apply. Please note that grantees will be required to maintain full-time student status and abide the terms and conditions outlined in a countersigned contract letter.

1. Candidates must be nationals of one of the following countries:

2. Applicants must be pursuing doctoral studies in the *social sciences and humanities*.
3. Members of the Roma community and other minority groups are encouraged to apply
4. Candidates must demonstrate proficiency in the spoken and written language of their host institution.
5. The envelope containing an application for the 2009 - 2010 academic year must be postmarked on or before: **APRIL 2, 2009 -- APPLICANTS MUST BE PURSUING A PH.D IN ASIA, AUSTRALIA, THE MIDDLE EAST, OR NORTH AMERICA. LATE APPLICATIONS WILL BE AUTOMATICALLY DISQUALIFIED.**

Ineligibility:

1. Applications for study in the student's home country or in Central Europe, the former Soviet Union, or Mongolia will not be considered.
2. Applications for non-doctoral study, language preparation, and/or summer school courses will not be considered.
3. Students with permanent resident status and/or asylum seekers in the country of the host academic institution are not eligible to apply. Only those with valid student visas in the host country are eligible to apply.

Documents Required Upon Application:

In addition to the application form below, please send one copy of the following. Any documents that are not in English should be accompanied by an official or university translation.

1. Curriculum Vitae -- (CV should include complete work history, extra-curricular activities, academic awards and publications).
2. Copy of your official letter of admission from the academic institution (if not available, explain why);
3. Official undergraduate and post-secondary school transcripts (new applicants only);
4. Copy of an official letter outlining the details of your scholarship or financial aid award (if separate from item 2 above) and any other documents confirming additional support.
5. Copy of the identification pages of your passport.
6. Copy of your visa -- (Students studying in the U.S should also enclose a copy of your I-20 or DS-2019 form).
7. Two academic reference letters from professors who have direct knowledge of your work and abilities. Students already enrolled in a Ph.D. program must furnish at least one letter of reference from a professor in the department in which they are studying.

Please Note: Omission of one or more of the documents mentioned above renders your application incomplete and will result in disqualification. In the event that a required document will become available only after you submit your application, please indicate this in your application and send the document as soon as possible.

Selection:

Students are selected in an open competition announced once a year. A team of experts (the GSGP Selection Committee) makes all grant decisions based on the quality of the application, written essays, academic records, and future goals. Preference will be given to students who demonstrate a commitment to the academic and social development of their home community or region. Applicants should take into consideration their priorities as well as the three year funding limit when applying. **Decisions of the Selection Committee are final.**

* NOTE: It is to your benefit to complete this section as thoroughly and accurately as possible. Applications without all required essays will be disqualified. The term ‘**re-applicants**’ applies to students who have received funding in prior years through the Global Supplementary Grant Program.

1. **Personal Essay.** Describe yourself and your interests in terms of your personal history and current circumstances. You may want to include information about your academic experiences, your long-term goals, or a unique experience that has changed your perspective on life. **Re-applicants**, please describe yourself and your interests with particular reference to your experience as a graduate student, noting specifically how your interests have developed or changed since your original application.
2. **Academic and Research Goals.** Please describe the focus of your dissertation research in geographic and theoretical terms. If you have not yet designed your dissertation proposal, please describe the area of research you would like to pursue. Please explain why you have chosen to pursue your studies at this particular university. **Re-applicants**, please discuss any new or changed directions you have decided to take in your studies and / or research and any unexpected challenges you have come across in your work or at your university. Finally, please state clearly where you are in the course of your doctoral studies (taking courses, proposal writing, research, fieldwork, dissertation writing, etc.).

 - a. What contributions do you hope to make, using your professional expertise and personal experiences, to the world?
 - b. What is the role of the university in strengthening civil society and generating social transformation?

Re-applicants: In lieu of writing a or b of Essay 4, re-applicants should discuss their **Work Influences:** Please discuss the publication, publications, or body of research that has proven to be the most influential in shaping your thinking about your field, the research you have done for seminar papers, and, if applicable at present, your dissertation topic.
